TABLE TALK

The most memorable “time together” often takes place around the table. This is your place to share your favorite recipes, memories, and family traditions.

Last summer, when we stayed at Carlsbad Seapointe Resort, we spent almost every day at the pool or the beach. It was so convenient coming back to our condo at the end of the day, and we had tons of fun making dinner together most nights.

My husband Brandon in particular loves cooking, and this is one of our family’s favorite recipes to bring on vacation. It’s pretty quick and easy to make in a timeshare kitchen. You don’t need fancy equipment or hours to produce a delicious meal that the whole family will appreciate. The fresh mango and bright flavors are perfect for summer, and we often pair the tacos with corn, fruit, or even rice.

You can get mahi mahi at most grocery stores, but our favorite place to buy seafood is at Pelly’s Fish Market off Avenida Encinas in Carlsbad. The market’s been there forever and has the freshest seafood we’ve found.



Mahi Mahi Fish Tacos with Chipotle Mango Salsa

INGREDIENTS

- 1 pound wild-caught, skin on, mahi mahi
- 3 tablespoons olive oil, divided
- 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon paprika
- 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon chipotle chile powder
- $\frac{3}{4}$ teaspoon garlic powder
- $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon onion powder
- $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon oregano

a pinch of salt and pepper

corn or flour tortillas for serving

CHIPOTLE MANGO AVOCADO SALSA

- 1 mango, peeled and chopped
- 1 Roma tomato, chopped
- 1 avocado, pitted and chopped
- 1 tablespoon chipotle in adobo (from canned chipotle chilies)
- 1 clove garlic, minced or grated
- $\frac{1}{2}$ lime, juiced
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup freshly chopped cilantro

a pinch of salt and pepper

Directions

Combine the paprika, chipotle chile powder, garlic powder, onion powder, and oregano in a bowl with a pinch of salt and pepper. Rub two tablespoons of olive oil on both sides of the mahi mahi. Then rub the fish with the spice mixture until well coated.



Combine the mango, Roma tomato, avocado, adobo sauce, garlic, lime juice, and cilantro in a bowl with a pinch of salt and pepper. Toss well. This mixture will keep in refrigerator for up to three days.

Heat a tablespoon of olive oil in a skillet over medium high heat. When hot but not smoking, add the seasoned mahi mahi, flesh

side down. Cook the fish about four to five minutes. Flip and cook another four to five minutes or until crisp and mostly cooked through.

Take the fish out of the pan and flake the fish with a fork, being careful to leave the skin behind.

In the last issue of *Time Together* you read about Teresa Ponce, a breast cancer survivor who found hope and healing during a week at Carlsbad Inn Beach Resort. We also shared our new giving program, **beCause Destination Matters**, which was inspired by a fellow owner.

Now it's our pleasure to introduce you to yet another inspiring woman, 22-year-old Anisha. Anisha was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis (MS) in 2009 at the age of 16. This disease has no known cure, and patients typically face overwhelming fatigue, mobility issues, and other impairments.

After her diagnosis, Anisha assumed that MS would control her life and prevent her from achieving her dreams. As she explains, “I thought that I would have to make every decision based off of the fact that I have MS, whether it was a daily task or one pertaining to my future. Not knowing where MS would take my health was just so frightening.”

Anisha's perspective became more hopeful in 2011, when the

Tips for Multi-Generational Vacations

**Nine people.
Four generations.
Ten days.**

How travel writer Christine Anderson spent a week with her extended family in Hawaii and lived to tell the tale.



When my parents announced they wanted to take our family to Maui for my dad's 60th birthday, I agreed to go with some hesitation. We had three red flags: I hadn't lived with my parents since I left for college in 2003, and we would be traveling five hours non-stop with my one-year-old niece and one family member with a fear of flying. But I'm not one to turn down a vacation and so, six months later, my husband and I boarded a plane to Maui and hoped for the best.

As it turns out, the trip was a huge success. I haven't enjoyed that kind of quality time with my family in more than 10 years. It was refreshing to reconnect with each other in such a beautiful destination and get to know the newer members of our family in a much deeper way. Our vacation together will remain one of my most treasured family memories.

What made our multi-generational vacation successful? I think a lot of it had to do with my stepmom's careful planning and that fact that everyone brought a certain level of flexibility to the experience. I've been on numerous vacations with my in-laws as well, and it seems like we get along best when there are clear expectations and everyone is able to voice their preferences while holding them loosely.

Here are a few suggestions gleaned from my experiences traveling with four generations:



1

Establish roles and expectations before you go



Who is paying for what? Will you be cooking or eating out? If everyone is covering their own expenses, establish budgets for food and activities beforehand. Figure out what activities are optional versus mandatory for your group.



2 Invite your family into the timeshare experience



When my family vacationed in Hawaii, we booked four separate hotel rooms for nine people. We could have easily stayed in multiple two-bedroom timeshare condos for half the cost and enjoyed even more square feet. If you're traveling with family, use your owner benefits to book your accommodations through [GPX](#) or [ResorTime](#) and share the perks of timeshare with your loved ones.



3 Take some time for yourself



Don't feel like you have to do everything with everyone. Maybe Grandma and Grandpa opt to lounge by the pool while everyone else hikes a mountain. That's okay. Embrace the diversity in your group and the fact that you may need a little space in order to enjoy your family the rest of the time you are together.



4 Push Yourself to Try Something New



My favorite family vacation memories center on new experiences, when a family member went outside of his or her comfort zone. In Belize, my sister-in-law got an adrenaline rush flying through the jungle on a zipline. In Hawaii, my grandma overcame her fear of water and went swimming for the first time since she was a kid. These memories will stay with me indefinitely.



5 Don't expect to do anything on your first day



When you're traveling as a group, it's important to have realistic expectations. That includes not doing anything on the first day of your trip. When it's just me and my husband, I like to jump right into activities. But I've learned that my family usually needs time to get oriented, shop for groceries, and settle into their accommodations.



6 Make sure basic needs are met



I'm one of those people who gets incredibly grumpy when I'm hungry, a trait I share with about half of my family members. We've learned through trial and error that it is important to have snacks on hand at all times. We also try to schedule regular bathroom breaks.



7 Get together after your trip to reminisce



I love cooking recipes inspired by my travels. It's even better sharing these dishes with family and reminiscing about the time we spent together. Even though we may not see each other every day like we did on vacation, reliving the memories reminds us that the heart of our relationships is still there.

Dear Tammy,

In 2013 I banked a July use week with GPX. We planned on exchanging into a resort in Tahoe but ended up visiting our grandkids in Boston the past two summers instead. Is it too late to use my credit?

Dear Harry,

It's not too late to use your credit, but you do have to act quickly. GPX credits expire two years from the start date of your deposited week. In your case, that would be this July. With your expiration date coming up, you have two options.

First, you can still book an exchange by visiting gpxvacations.com. If Tahoe is still your first choice, we have several weeks at Tahoe Beach & Ski Club, the newest resort in our family. Just remember, the last day of your exchange week must predate the expiration of your credit. That is, if your credit expires July 25, your exchange week must end before that date.

Alternately, you can extend your credit for up to 12 months by calling us at (866) 325- 6295. This is a particularly good option if you find an exchange week after July. We do charge between \$49 and \$99 for this service, depending on the length of your extension.

I can't help but ask—have you invited your family to join you in Tahoe? Our two-bedroom condos offer great value and extra space for multiple generations. If your credit is only valid for a studio or one-bedroom unit, you can always upgrade for a small fee.

Whatever you choose, I hope you have a blast on your vacation!

Dear Tammy,

Is there any way I can book a two to three day stay in the Carlsbad area? My dad is coming to visit us for the weekend, and I'd like to find something more economical than \$300 per night for a tiny hotel room. Thank you in advance!

Dear Margaret,
